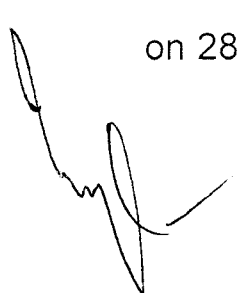

FINAL ORDER NO. OMBUDSMAN/2014/609

The Appellant, Shri Sushil Sharma, has filed an appeal on 13.02.2014 against the order of the Consumer Grievance Redressal Forum – Tata Power Delhi Distribution Ltd. (CGRF-TPDDL) dated 13.01.2014 on the ground that LPSC was not refunded and that compensation for harassment was less.

The facts of the case are that the meter No.70003418 installed on 28.02.2007 was changed on 19.06.2013 on the ground that it was



burnt/reading was not visible. The last O.K. reading recorded on 03.05.2013 led to a bill of Rs.68,768/- for the period 04.05.2013 to 18.06.2013 on the basis of consumption recorded from 06.05.2012 to 03.05.2013. The cost of the meter of Rs.4,870/- was also levied on the consumer. When the matter was adjudicated in the CGRF, the meter was found OK and the facts led to an order reversing the charges and the cost of the meter. In addition the Complainant was given a compensation of Rs.3,000/-.

Against this he came here for an appeal. During the hearing, the DISCOM agreed to not levy the LPSC, which was earlier overlooked. Regarding the issue of compensation, no real case was made out for enhancement of the compensation given by the CGRF and hence this plea was not accepted.

The appeal is, therefore, dismissed with the above remarks.
